Mr. Finn moved to approve the minutes of the previous. Ms. Dressler seconded. On called vote, all voted in favor.

Mr. Finn moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Ms. Dressler seconded. On called vote, all voted in favor.

Ms. Dressler called for public comment. Ms. Goldman reported on upcoming America 250 events, including a late April play in Washingtonville and a bike parade.

Under public comment, Mr. Kelley asked about a change to building height from 60 to 80 feet in the proposed Data Center Ordinance. Mr. Finn said the height increase, as well as an increased setback was aimed at lessening the impact to the environment and neighbors.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Ms. Dressler moved to approve an application for a \$5,000.00 Visitor's Bureau Tourism Grant from the Danville Business Alliance to support the 40th annual Spring Fling. Ms. Good said the event scheduled for May 2 will feature the America 250 mobile unit. Mr. Finn seconded. On called vote, all voted in favor.

Ms. Dressler moved to draft a letter of support for the Danville Area School District's application of a DCNR Park Rehabilitation and Development Grant to be used for the development of athletic fields. The fields will be utilized by students as well as the public. Mr. Finn seconded. On called vote, all voted in favor.

Mr. Finn noted receipt of correspondence from the Thomas Beaver Free Library requesting Commissioners spread word of its services beyond reading materials, such as free access to computers and Wi-Fi, low-cost printing, faxing and copying services, programs for children and adults, one-on-one help with computers and for adult literacy, lectures, and space for adults to gather, socialize or work.

Mr. Finn moved to pay the following bills: General Account, \$670,096.95; Children & Youth, \$90,506.28; Liquid Fuels, \$64.75; Human and Community Service, \$2,845.65; Other Funds, \$43,334.53. Ms. Dressler seconded. On called vote, all voted in favor.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
